Personal/family history Red Flags to identify individuals at increased risk for a hereditary cancer condition who would most likely benefit from referral to genetics

## CANCER DIAGNOSIS AT A YOUNGER AGE THAN EXPECTED

e.g. colorectal cancer at/before age 40, breast cancer at/before age 45



#### SEVERAL AFFECTED GENERATIONS



This suggests an autosomal dominant pattern typical of most hereditary cancer conditions
